#### 1982/1983 ANNUAL REPORT OF THE STATE APPELLATE DEFENDER OFFICE

#### History

The State Appellate Defender Office currently operates pursuant to 1978 PA 620 (MCL 780.711 <u>et seq</u>) and continues to be governed by the seven-member State Appellate Defender Commission, which is also charged with overseeing the private appellate assigned counsel roster. The State Appellate Defender Office was established in 1970 to provide competent legal representation in criminal post-conviction matters. It had its genesis in Michigan Supreme Court Administrative Order 1970-1 and has functioned under the auspices of the Supreme Court within the office of the State Court Administrator since its creation.

From 1970 to 1978 the Office was based in and operated only out of Detroit. However, in January of 1979, the Lansing division of the office began operations. That division was established to improve the delivery of services and facilitate access by more individuals and agencies to the Defender Office's expertise in the area of criminal law and procedure.

# <u>Staff</u>

Fifteen (15) staff attorneys, the Defender, Chief Deputy Defender, Legal Resources Project Director and Training Coordinator are housed in the Detroit Office. Four (4) staff attorneys and the Deputy Defender are housed in the Lansing

office. In 82/83 these attorneys and administrators were supported by two (2) research attorneys, ten (10) legal secretaries, an Investigator and Paralegal Assistant, eight (8) Administrative Assistants, two and one-half (2-1/2) clerks, and one (1) receptionist. Approximately fifteen (15) part-time student and post-graduate legal research assistants are employed when funds are available.

Since 1980, paralegal and criminal justice students from Michigan State University, Mercy College, Henry Ford College and other schools have been used to provide paralegal-type assistance to the staff. These students work for credit toward degrees.

Each year the State Appellate Defender Office designates one of its staff attorneys to teach the Criminal Appellate Practice Course at the University of Michigan Law School. Course students provide research assistance on real cases assigned to that teaching attorney in return for credits and the unique learning experience the course offers.

A specialized unit, designed to handle a high volume of cases, has been able to handle 20% to 30% more cases than a regular attorney unit when the office has received funding to hire law students and post-graduates on a part-time basis to assist the staff attorneys in that unit.

Funding for student assistance or additional attorney positions will be crucial in up-coming years as the appellate assigned

counsel system becomes operational and the State Appellate Defender Office is required to handle at least one (1) out of every four (4) indigent criminal appeals. The State Appellate Defender Office's annual intake is expected to increase under the mandatory assignment provisions of the system. See Administrative Order No. 1981-7, 412 Mich lxv (1982).

#### Case Activity

The Defender Office is appointed to cases by the Michigan Supreme Court, the Michigan Court of Appeals, the Michigan circuit courts and the Recorder's Court for the City of Detroit to represent indigent criminal defendants on regular appeals and in a variety of other post-conviction proceedings.

A State Appellate Defender attorney's work consists of reviewing transcripts and lower court records, interviewing clients, investigating, researching issues, filing all necessary pleadings and conducting hearings and oral arguments.

State Appellate Defender Office attorneys appear at all levels of the Michigan and Federal judiciaries. They make regular client visits and lower court appearances in virtually all areas of this state and appear before the Michigan Supreme Court and the Court of Appeals, and, in selected cases, before Michigan's Federal District Courts, the Federal Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit and the United States Supreme Court.

#### A. 1981/1982 ACTIVITY

During the previous reporting year (July 1, 1981 - June 30, 1982) the Office accepted a record 820 assignments, and office attorneys handled a similar record 783 cases: 18 regular staff attorneys handled 606 cases; 2 Special Unit attorneys handled 177 cases (this unit does not handle trial or complex appeals).

During the previous <u>fiscal year</u> (October 1, 1981 - September 30, 1982), the Supreme Court, Court of Appeals, forty-five (45) circuits and Recorder's Court assigned the State Appellate Defender Office. Ten (10) circuits did not (1, 8, 13, 15, 16, 17, 20, 24, 45 and 52); and seven (7) of those ten (10) had not over the previous three (3) years (1, 8, 15, 16, 20, 45 and 52). Ten (10) circuits that did not appoint the State Appellate Defender Office during the 1980/1981 reporting year (7, 9, 12, 14, 19, 22, 33, 34, 44 and 47) did in 1981/1982.

Of the forty-eight (48) assigning authorities, appointing the State Appellate Defender Office during 1981/1982, eleven (11) circuits and the Recorder's Court reduced the number of assignments they were making to the State Appellate Defender Office; thirty (30) circuits (including four (4) that had not previously assigned the State Appellate Defender Office) increased the number of cases assigned to the State Appellate Defender Office; and six (6) showed no change.

At the close of the 1981/1982 reporting period, the office had a total of 1,283 open, active cases, 820 new assignments had been received, 735 cases closed and a total of 2,018 cases processed.

# B. 1982/1983 ACTIVITY

The ten (10) circuits that did not appoint the State Appellate Defender Office during 81/82 continued their past practice in 82/83. Seven (7) of the ten (10) circuits (7, 9, 12, 14, 19, 33, 44) that appointed the State Appellate Defender Office in 81/82 but had not the previous year continue to assign SADO only in extraordinary situations.

During fiscal year 82/83 (October 1, 1982 - September 30, 1983), the office's eighteen (18) staff attorneys and two (2) deputies handled 582 cases, and the Special Unit attorney handled eighty-three (83) (one unit attorney left and was not replaced), for a total of 665 cases. Fifty-seven (57) of those appeals were special assignments (these range from US Supreme Court briefs to responses to prosecutor appeals) 327 were pleas, and 281 were trials.

From July 1, 1982, to June 30, 1983, the office received 725 new assignments. At the close of this reporting period, it had 1,250 open active cases, had closed 831 cases and processed a total of 2,081 cases. A graphic depicting 1982/1983 case activity follows this narrative.

## **Collateral Services and Special Projects**

In addition to the work produced in each case, the Office is involved in several collateral areas and special projects. The Legal Resources Project, in its sixth year, again responded to more than three thousand (3,000) requests for assistance, provided more than fifty thousand (50,000) pages of materials, and reached more than one thousand (1,000) subscribers through the Criminal Defense Newsletter.

The office continued to conduct training seminars for attorneys representing indigent defendants in criminal proceedings in conjunction with the Criminal Defense Attorneys of Michigan. Several seminars and video training seminars were held this year.

The State Appellate Defender Office was heavily involved in the planning of the Criminal Advocacy Program, jointly sponsered by the Wayne County Circuit Court and Detroit Recorder's Court in 1983. The State Appellate Defender Office was instrumental in obtaining a grant for the continuation of the Criminal Advocacy Program from the Michigan Justice Training Commission. At the State Appellate Defender Office's request, the Michigan Justice Training Commission also funded three (3) State Appellate Defender Office sponsored projects -- revision of the State Appellate Defender Office's <u>Practice and Procedure Mannual</u>, which will include a separate section on brief writing and advocacy, and the <u>Trial Book</u> started by the Legal Aid and Defender's Office.

Through the efforts of its Special Projects Coordinator, the State Appellate Defender Office nearly completed the automation of its word and data processing systems. Under the direction of the State Appellate Defender Commission, over the next year, the State Appellate Defender Office will design similar systems for the appellate assigned counsel administrator office and attempt to interface them with its own. If full funding is granted to the State Appellate Defender Office and the Assigned Counsel Administrator in the 1983/1984 budget, the entire system (both the Defender and private counsel components) should be operational by the end of 1985.
