One hero that I know of is Richard Phillips. There are many heroes but he is one of my favorites and he is special.


In 1972 Richard was sent to prison for murder. Even though he did not do it, people lied about what happened and Richard was sent to prison in a snap!


After a long time working hard to free Richard the real bad guys told the truth. Even after finding out what really happened, the court still did not let him out for another 8 years!
