AFFIDAVIT OF HON. MARY BETH KELLY

Hon. Mary Beth Kelly, first being duly sworn, deposes and says:

1. I make this affidavit in support of the defendants' Answer to the Complaint for Superintending Control filed in the above captioned case and the Brief in Support of Answer.

2. The facts stated herein are within my own personal knowledge or are reflected in the official records for the Third Circuit Court, attached as exhibits to the defendants' Answer and Brief in Support of Answer. I am competent to testify to these facts, and will do so if called as a witness.
3. During all the time periods relevant to this case, I was and continue to be the Chief Judge of the Third Circuit Court.
4. In addition to performing the duties of a chief judge under the auspices of MCR 8.110, I have also maintained an active docket of cases in the Juvenile Section of the Court's Family Division.
5. In 2005, I chaired the Juvenile Docket Task Force, the Report of which is attached as Plaintiffs' exhibit 26. As recounted in the Report, p 3, committees were formed to identify barriers and make recommendations regarding case flow process so that cases could be adjudicated within applicable time standards so as to achieve a more speedy adjudication of juvenile matters where given the participants involved, time is often of the essence in ensuring that justice is delivered to juveniles and that their best interests are thereby served.
6. Two of the barriers identified in the Report, p. 5, were as follows: One of these was the impact of conflicts due to judges' and referees' dockets, about which the Report stated, "Frequently attorneys are scheduled for hearings in both referee and judge courtrooms at the same time, thus causing delays in one or both of the courtrooms." Another barrier identified was substitution of counsel, about which the Report stated, "Many times where there is substitution of counsel, it may cause delays in case processing in order for the new counsel to become familiar with the case."
7. In my own personal experience as a judge presiding over juvenile matters, I routinely encountered or observed an alarming number of instances in cases where assigned counsel did not appear on behalf of the juvenile to whom he or she was assigned to represent but instead, either did not appear or used or employed substituted counsel.
8. In my own personal experience as a judge presiding over juvenile matters, I routinely observed an alarming number of instances in which assigned counsel was not prepared to effectively represent their client on the day of a hearing. This lack of preparedness was especially evident in substituted counsel. The lack of preparedness led to frequent adjournments.
9. In my own personal experience as a judge presiding over juvenile matters, it became apparent to me that the level of representation of juveniles was not especially high. For example, in the course of adjudicating juvenile matters, few motions or trial briefs would ever be filed by assigned counsel. Instead, assigned counsel would simply show up for hearings and trials.

10. In the Complaint filed in the case sub judice, the plaintiffs have noted several cases in which they assert it was especially important for the juvenile to have continuity of counsel. In one of these, Terri N., Case No. 91395330, for which plaintiff Jeremy Brand was appointed counsel, the official records of the Court concerning attorney attendance in this case, attached hereto, reflect that although he appeared at a pre-trial hearing held on January 25, 2005, he missed the next four hearings and did not reappear on the case until October 11, 2006. In the meantime, three different attorneys appeared to represent the juvenile.
11. In another case referenced in the Complaint, Tony B. Case No. 00386361, in which plaintiff Deborah Trent was appointed to represent the juvenile, the official records of the Court, attached hereto, indicate that although Ms. Trent appeared on behalf of her client on October 26, 2004, she missed the next four hearings and did not reappear until February 3, 2006. In the intervening four hearings, her client was represented by three different attorneys.
12. Another way of demonstrating the lack of continuity of counsel prior to the adoption of Local Administrative Order 2006-08 was to randomly select two weeks in 2006 (the third week in April and the first week in August 2006) and to examine cases in which the plaintiff attorneys in this case were assigned cases which came up for a hearing. Based on the official records of the Court reduced to a table attached to the affidavit of Leonard Branka, the Court's Director of Assigned Counsel Services, it is shown that plaintiff Jeremy Brand had substituted counsel appear for him in eight cases; plaintiff Sydney Ruby had substituted counsel appear for him in seven cases; in four cases respectively, substituted counsel appeared for plaintiff Patrick Devine and plaintiff Muriel Shillingford; and in one case each, substituted counsel appeared for plaintiff Sue Radulovich and plaintiff Deborah Trent.
13. Finally, yet another way of demonstrating that prior to the adoption of Local Administrative Order 2006-08 substitution of counsel was a serious problem confronting the Court can be shown by a table, attached to the affidavit of Leonard Branka and taken from the Court's official records of proceedings in the Juvenile Section on the same two weeks noted in ¶ 10, that demonstrates that in these two weeks substituted counsel was used in 210 hearings.
14. In order to remedy the chronic problem of frequent substitution of attorneys, in furtherance of the recommendation of the Report, p 11, that judge-referee teams be formed (under which two referees would be assigned to each judge, judge demands emanating out of cases before the two assigned referees would be assigned to the judge in the team), and in an attempt to obtain more effective assistance of counsel, and based on a program that had been successfully implemented in the Seventh Circuit Court (Genesee County), the Court determined to have a designated group of attorneys represent juveniles who came before the referees on a team or a particular referee.

15. In April 2006, I authorized a request for proposal (the RFP) to be issued which solicited bids from attorney groups to provide representation for juveniles in neglect and delinquency cases in a particular referee courtroom. A copy of the RFP is attached to plaintiffs' Complaint as exhibit 2.
16. Among the provisions of the RFP, was a requirement that a prospective vendor describe in detail how it would render legal services in compliance with all statutory and ethical requirements. See RFP, pp 4-5.
17. The RFP, p 7, § (III)(D)(2), reflected that the Court's selection of one or more vendors would be based not only on the basis of cost effectiveness but also on an evaluation of "a. The expertise and past experiences in providing legal representation to juveniles in general and in particular in Wayne County," and "b. The appropriateness of the plan for the delivery of legal services as contained in a Proposal and whether it sufficiently conforms to the organization of the Juvenile Section as described in the RFP."
18. The Court did indeed take cost into consideration since the Court's funds to provide representation for juveniles are limited.
19. In response to the RFP, the Court received bids from sixteen attorneys or attorney groups including two of the plaintiffs in the instant case, the Trial Lawyers Association of Wayne County Juvenile Court and Radulovich.
20. After a thorough vetting of the proposals, and based on the recommendations of a committee formed to review the proposals, I authorized the Court to enter into contracts with four attorney groups to cover all twelve referee courtrooms, and one other attorney group to cover the half docket of the Chief Referee and certain miscellaneous dockets. The Court did not enter into contracts with the Trial Lawyers Association of Wayne County Juvenile Court or with Radulovich.
21. Subsequently, in December 2006, Radulovich made an inquiry to me via an e-mail, a copy of which is attached, to inquire if the Court would enter into a contract with an attorney group that she would form for the purpose of representing parents in neglect proceedings.
22. In the meantime, pursuant to MCR 8.123, which requires trial courts to codify their plans for the delivery of court appointed attorney services promulgated LAO 2006-08, attached as exhibit 1 to the Complaint, which among its provisions called for the Court to contract with attorney groups to provide exclusive representation for juveniles in both delinquency and neglect cases, LAO 2006-08 ¶ (III)(A), and empowered me to remove appointed counsel in **post-dispositional** hearings in order to expeditiously implement the provisions of LAO 2006-08 ¶ (III)(A) "and to ensure that the interests of the children and the public are properly served." LAO 2006-08(III)(D)(2).

23. On October 27, 2006, the State Court Administrator's Office (SCAO), approved the promulgation of LAO 2006-08.
24. In November, 2006, pursuant to the authority granted in LAO 2006-08(III)(D)(2), in order to implement the contracts that the Court had executed, I commenced to issue orders removal counsel and reassigning the case to the appropriate new attorney group. Notably, these orders were issued only where the case was in post dispositional status.
25. In promulgating LAO 2006-08 and issuing the orders of removal and reassignment I was cognizant of the requirement of MCL 712A.17c(9) that a lawyer guardian ad litem could be removed only for good cause, but mindful of the problems the Court had encountered with the old system of assigning counsel, as described above, and desirous to improve the sound administration of justice, I was of the opinion that good cause existed to remove presently appointed counsel, but only where the case has proceeded into post dispositional status, in order to expeditiously implement the new system of assigning counsel through contracting with attorney groups.
26. LAO ¶ (III)(D)(3) also permitted attorneys who had received a notice of reassignment to bring a motion before the Chief Judge to remain as assigned counsel in one or more cases, and that upon a demonstration of "special circumstances," the Chief Judge retained the discretion to allow the moving attorney to remain as the assigned counsel.
27. In December 2006, Radulovich filed a motion to strike order of removal of counsel on behalf on one of the juveniles whom she had previously been assigned to represent and on behalf of numerous other juveniles. The motion is attached to the Complaint as exhibit 27. In that motion, she raised many of the same legal challenges that are presently asserted in the case at bar as to the validity of the removal or reassignment order, but did not expressly argue that special circumstances would justify her being retained on the case of the named juvenile, nor any of the others mentioned in the exhibit attached to her motion
28. . In that motion, she also sought the award of costs and extraordinary legal fees. On January 30, 2007, I denied Radulovich's motion in an Opinion and Order, copies of which are attached as exhibit 28 to the Complaint.
29. Subsequent to the promulgation of LAO 2006-08, from December 8, 2006 through April 5, 2007, I presided over the adjudication of at least 97 motions that were filed by attorneys seeking to remain appointed counsel or LGAL in juvenile cases based on a particularized demonstration of special circumstances and thus be excepted from the provisions of LAO 2006-08(III)(D)(3). In adjudicating these motions I articulated and consistently applied several specific factors: 1) the length of the case and the duration of the attorney-client relationship; 2) the age of the young person, i.e., whether the young person would be old enough to know who his or her lawyer

was and appreciate the nature of the attorney-client relationship; and 3) whether "special circumstances" existed, such as the mental incapacity of the young person such that the continuity of the attorney-client relationship even in the post dispositional stage would be important to maintain.

30. According to a table of the results of those proceedings prepared by my court reporter, David Cucinella, attached as an exhibit to the Defendants' Brief, I granted 68 of 97 motions that were filed by attorneys seeking to remain appointed counsel or LGAL in juvenile cases and denied 29 of these motions.


David Cucinella, being first duly sworn, deposes and says that:

4 COURT CLERK: This is -- I'll call the lowest
5 case number into the record. In the matter of Sharita
6 Evans. Case number 91-295098.
7 THE COURT: Okay, appearances, please.
8 MS. VADINO: Good morning, your Honor. I believe
9 I'm the only one here on this matter this morning.
10 Christina Vadino, P-29484, I am the moving party.
11 THE COURT: Okay.
12 MS. VADINO: Good morning, your Honor. I am here
13 today on this matter, as well as five other cases. I
14 have filed a motion which I believe you have a copy of.
15 THE COURT: I do.
16 MS. VADINO: To request under the Court's
17 Administrative Order 2006-08, that I be permitted to
18 remain as lawyer guardian ad litem for Sharita, her
19 sister, Tierra Campbell, and the other children that I
20 have listed in my motion.
21 Your Honor, how would the court like me to
22 proceed in this matter argument?
23 THE COURT: I like to adjudicate these cases on a
24 case-by-case basis. Your motion does set forth relevant
25 facts with respect to the specific young people, but

1 there are other facts that are necessary for me to know
2 in adjudication of these cases.

3 The older the young person the more likely it is
4 that the court would find good cause to except the case
5 from the local administrative order, because presumably
6 an older person is aware of the existence of the
7 attorney-client relationship, and is aware who their
8 lawyer is, and has some appreciation of the attorney-
9 client privilege. So, I'm appreciative that you've set
10 forth the ages of these young people, and that these
11 young people are not two and three years old, as some
12 lawyers have moved to stay on the cases. However, one
13 fact that I find particularly probative as well is to
14 whether the continuity of the attorney-client
15 relationship is disrupted is the length of case -- or
16 the length of the representation. And in each of these
17 cases, that information is not made known to me. The
18 case numbers are listed, some of which suggest that some
19 of these cases are very old, and one of which suggests
20 that these -- that the case is fairly new. However,
21 because sometimes a sibling case can result in an old
22 case I can't tell the length of case. And so I would
23 like to go through each of these cases, and if you could
24 tell me how long you've represented these young people.

25 MS. VADINO: I am prepared to do that on each

1 case, your Honor.

2 THE COURT: The other fact that is significant to
3 me is whether or not you have had substitute counsel
4 appear in your stead in these cases such that the young
5 person truly hasn't enjoyed continuity of counsel that
6 would be broken anyway. In many of our cases counsel
7 have other lawyers appear in their stead and the young
8 person often doesn't know who their lawyer is as a
9 result, and there is not truly any continuity to begin
10 with.

11 MS. VADINO: Your Honor, if the court is willing
12 to accept my representations I can provide information
13 on all of those questions in general and in specific.

14 THE COURT: Okay. Please.

15 MS. VADINO: Your Honor, since I have stated
16 the -- I have listed the children in a certain order,
17 may I proceed according to the order in the motion?

18 THE COURT: Please.

19 MS. VADINO: Okay. As to Jalen Richardson, your
20 Honor, Jalen's case, at least on the current set of
21 petitions that has been before the court, it has been
22 pending since August 16th of '05, and that is how long I
23 have been representing Jalen. Jalen, since that time,
24 has had three changes of placement. There have been
25 several subsequent petitions. He was returned to his

1 mother at one point, and then the relationship blew up
2 and he took himself out of the home, which the court
3 thereafter decided was a good move on his part.

4 There have been many hearings in Jalen's case,
5 including a couple that were on an emergency basis such
6 as prelims. in the midst of the case after he had been
7 returned to his mother and then a new petition was
8 filed.

9 THE COURT: Have you ever had substitute counsel
10 appear in your stead?

11 MS. VADINO: Your Honor, my file reflects that I
12 had substitute counsel in the person of Ms. McAlwith
13 (phonetic) during a vacation, and the prelim. that I
14 mentioned that I did not have notice of because it was
15 an emergency hearing, house counsel, Nick Solis, served
16 on that one. Those were the only two instances that I
17 could find in which I was not present with Jalen.

18 I have also seen Jalen on numerous occasions at
19 the various places where he's lived.

20 THE COURT: Okay. The court will not find good
21 cause in this matter to continue your representation,
22 primarily in light of the relatively short duration of
23 the representation, a little bit over one year. Again,
24 the representation is not of a particularly longstanding
25 nature, and for that reason the court will not find good

1 cause.

2 Javonte Childs, please.

3 MS. VADINO: Javonte Childs, your Honor, I have
4 been on Javonte's case since he was a very small boy,
5 since June of '06 of 1997.

6 THE COURT: Okay.

7 MS. VADINO: And this is a young man who, in
8 addition to the facts that I have set forward, suffered
9 the loss of his first long term caseworker Denise Terry
10 Smith when she died suddenly of a heart attack in '04.

11 THE COURT: Okay.

12 MS. VADINO: He has had numerous caseworkers
13 since. He is the young man who is desperately seeking
14 adoptive placement or at least a foster home, and I have
15 been working very hard to help him achieve that.

16 THE COURT: Okay.

17 MS. VADINO: My file reflects, your Honor, that
18 during that period of time, which totals over nine
19 years, that I could only find two occasions in which
20 I've had substitutes.

21 THE COURT: Good. In light of the long term
22 nature of the representation, the diligent attempts to
23 bring permanency to Javonte's life and the relative few
24 times in which Ms. Vadino has had substitute counsel
25 appear in her stead, the court will find that good cause

1 exists to except this case from Local Administrative
2 Order 2006-08.

3 MS. VADINO: Thank you, your Honor.

4 THE COURT: Also, in light of the age of Javonte
5 Childs as well.

6 MS. VADINO: Next, your Honor, is Theresa Kliza.
7 Theresa is 17. She is the minor mother of a two-year-
8 old daughter, Naja, who is not a court ward. I have bee
9 on the case since September of '03, which was --
10 although this is a case -- I believe the case number
11 begins with the digits 92, Theresa was a court ward as a
12 very small child. Then that was resolved, I believe by
13 her becoming -- by her being in the -- under the
14 guardianship of her mother and the case was dismissed.
15 The case was brought back to the court, and my
16 representation began in '03 when her grandmother decided
17 for various reasons that she could not handle Theresa.
18 Theresa has had at least six placements during the
19 period of representation. I have visited her in all of
20 them. I have been in touch with her during her
21 pregnancy, and celebrated the birth of her child with
22 her at Crittenton in Jackson. And in terms of
23 substitutions, your Honor, I believe -- I did not find
24 any, I think there may have been one during a period of
25 vacation.

1 THE COURT: Okay. The court will find that good
2 cause exists to except the Theresa Kliza representation
3 from Local Administrative Order 2006-08 for several
4 reasons. First, Theresa Kliza is a minor mother, which
5 puts her into a special needs category. Second, Ms.
6 Vadino has very successfully represented the young
7 person as is reflective in the fact that the two-year-
8 old daughter is not a court ward, which is a tremendous
9 accomplishment in and of itself. In addition, the fact
10 that Ms. Vadino was present for the birth of her child
11 at Crittenton also shows a level of advocacy that the
12 court believes should be continued.

13 MS. VADINO: Your Honor, just one small
14 correction. I think I stated I celebrated the birth, I
15 did not mean to state that I was present at the birth.

16 THE COURT: At the time of the birth?

17 MS. VADINO: Right. But I visited with her
18 shortly after.

19 THE COURT: Okay. Still, the court finds good
20 cause.

21 MS. VADINO: Thank you, your Honor. Okay, where
22 does that leave us?

23 THE COURT: Jimmean Richardson.

24 MS. VADINO: Yes. Jimmean Richardson, the court
25 may recall having --

1 THE COURT: I recall this matter.

2 MS. VADINO: Yes. Jimmean is a young man who, an
3 extremely unfortunate situation, he has had a couple of
4 attorneys -- actually, he's had a number of attorneys
5 including a delinquency attorney, and I was not his
6 first delinquency attorney. This is a large family of
7 permanent court wards. I replaced a previous LGAL in --
8 well, let's see. Oh, in August of '04. I do not
9 remember the reason why the previous LGAL was removed.

10 Jimmean as I state in my motion has suffered the
11 actual loss of his grandfather, and the loss of his
12 grandmother's ability to care for him because of
13 Alzheimer's. Jimmean is in an extremely vulnerable
14 position, which is why I included him in this motion,
15 your Honor. I believe that I have developed a rapport
16 with Jimmean and his family. He is now in a residential
17 placement with Don Bosco, and although I think that he
18 has been cooperative with his caseworkers in staying
19 there, and is doing fairly well, the court may remember
20 that he was before the court on the AWOLP docket not too
21 long ago. And I fear that -- you know, he's just in a
22 vulnerable position, and I think that I can continue to
23 assist him and his family in hopefully reuniting. So, I
24 would ask that the court, given his age and situation,
25 permit me to continue to make those efforts.

1 THE COURT: Okay. The court will find that good
2 cause exists to except the Jimmean Richardson case from
3 Local Administrative Order 2006-08, for the reasons
4 cited by counsel. The court is familiar with Jimmean
5 Richardson's case. He has been on the delinquency and
6 the AWOLP, and as counsel has stated, his prior lawyer
7 was removed for cause. Ms. Vadino is known to the court
8 to be a very zealous advocate, and Mr. Richardson is in
9 need of that level of advocacy given his situation. And
10 so the court will find for all of those reasons that
11 good cause exists.

12 MS. VADINO: Thank you, your Honor. Now, next as
13 to Tierra Campbell and Sharita Evans, actually my
14 representation for these young ladies only dates back to
15 June of '06. At that time, if I remember correctly, one
16 of them was already before the court and had an LGAL,
17 and the other child came before the court, Sharita came
18 before the court. Sharita came before the court on a
19 petition. She had been living with her father, it was
20 not working out. He came to a hearing and wanted to --
21 was trying to decide whether to file incorrigibility on
22 her, and then decided to leave her at the court, which
23 resulted in a neglect petition being filed against him.
24 They had had an extremely rocky last few months,
25 including a period of time when the agency was very slow

1 to provide the court ordered services, and that has
2 required some vigilance.

3 Tierra is in totally different circumstances.
4 She has been a court ward for a long time, having been
5 brought into care when her long term legal guardian
6 became -- because of alcoholism was no longer able to
7 provide a home for her.

8 Tierra contacts me a great deal because she is
9 not happy with the plan that her caseworkers have
10 devised for her. And although there's nothing
11 particularly inappropriate about the plan, she's 18, and
12 feels that she ought to be able to create her own plan.
13 And so her caseworker and the supervisor and I are
14 working very hard with Tierra to try to figure out
15 something that will satisfy all -- satisfy the law and
16 keep off the AWOL docket, your Honor. So, I would ask
17 that the court permit me to continue to represent these
18 two sisters, because of their vulnerable circumstances
19 and their age. I note that I have not yet had any
20 substitutes on those two matters, which are both heard
21 on separate days because of particular characteristics
22 of the cases.

23 THE COURT: Okay. And again, in light of the age
24 of the young people, and their need for zealous
25 advocacy, in light of their peculiar circumstances and

1 the fact that Ms. Vadino has developed rapport and an
2 attorney-client relationship with these young people,
3 who again are in a very precarious situation, the court
4 will find that good cause exists to except their cases
5 from Local Administrative Order 2006-08. And again, in
6 making these rulings, I do want to note that the facts
7 that I am relying upon do tend to be the age of the
8 young people, the zealous advocacy of Ms. Vadino, and
9 her ability -- her somewhat unique ability to establish
10 good rapport with these young people. So those are the
11 facts as stated on the record that I am relying upon.

12 MS. VADINO: Thank you, your Honor. And lastly,
13 lastly today, I have Shaquita Smith.

14 THE COURT: Excuse me. Shaquita is 18, is she
15 not?

16 MS. VADINO: She is 18, your Honor. She is a
17 permanent ward. Shaquita has been my client since 1994.

18 THE COURT: Right.

19 MS. VADINO: Shaquita was a victim of very
20 serious sexual abuse.

21 THE COURT: Right.

22 MS. VADINO: And Shaquita has always had extreme
23 psychological and emotional problems.

24 THE COURT: Right.

25 MS. VADINO: Which have resulted in her being in

1 various types of residential treatment for most of the
2 time of her wardship.

3 Shaquita recently graduated from high school. We
4 were very happy about that. She had a wonderful
5 caseworker, Patricia Randazzo, who took a different job
6 and still keeps in touch with her, but that's been a bit
7 of a loss to Shaquita, although her new caseworker is a
8 very good and very attentive to her.

9 Right now Shaquita is -- she's at large, because
10 she did not want to remain in the placement that was
11 found for her after she aged out of Wedgewood.
12 Actually, she didn't age out, because -- but she -- she
13 didn't age out, but she was placed in a -- I won't say a
14 supervised independent living situation, but she had a
15 home care provider, it didn't work out. She contacted
16 me and her worker during the late part of the summer and
17 said that she wasn't going to stay there. To make a
18 long story short, she was brought back into Wedgewood,
19 but did not stay there either.

20 THE COURT: She's not on the AWOL docket though?

21 MS. VADINO: She's not on the AWOL docket. She
22 may well be soon, but she is --

23 THE COURT: Well, when you say she's at large,
24 are her whereabouts known?

25 MS. VADINO: No.

1 THE COURT: Well, then she should be on the AWOL
2 docket.

3 MS. VADINO: I don't disagree, your Honor. But
4 these are recent events.

5 THE COURT: Okay.

6 MS. VADINO: I think that the -- she left the
7 placement shortly before I even filed this motion last
8 week.

9 THE COURT: Okay.

10 MS. VADINO: So, you know, Shaquita will be a
11 permanent ward for, you know, at least another year, if
12 not more. And although she did manage to complete her
13 high school education and does have some skills and some
14 goals, it's going to be a tough road for her. So, I
15 would ask that the court allow me to remain until it's
16 time for her to be dismissed.

17 THE COURT: Okay. Well -- and again, for the
18 same reasons the court will except the Shaquita Smith
19 case from Local Administrative Order 2006-08, because
20 again, the long term nature of the representation, the
21 established attorney-client relationship and the zealous
22 advocacy that Ms. Vadino has provided on behalf of Ms.
23 Smith.

24 MS. VADINO: Thank you very much, your Honor.

25 Your Honor, I have brought with me today orders on these

1 matters. And with the exception of the one that the
2 court is not going to except from the administrative
3 order, may I have the court sign these?

4 THE COURT: Of course. You can give them to Ms.
5 Clifton. Thank you.

6 MS. VADINO: Thank you.

7 (Proceedings concluded)

**AFFIDAVIT
CHILD ADVOCACY PROGRAM, PLLC**

Mayssa Attia, Esquire, having been duly sworn says:

1. Affiant was one of the organizers, is the resident agent and a member of Child Advocacy Program, PLLC, a Michigan professional limited liability company, and makes this affidavit based upon personal knowledge.
2. Upon receipt of and in response to the Wayne County Circuit Court Family Division Juvenile Section 's request for proposals for the delivery of legal services on behalf of juveniles, Affiant initiated a search to locate other attorneys to form an organization dedicated to this purpose with experience in representing juveniles in both neglect and abuse and delinquency matters.
3. Affiant states that not only did the member attorneys actually selected satisfy all of the Court's requirements, in addition each of the six members has at the minimum nine (9) years of experience in representing children in both neglect and abuse and delinquency matters. This experience included substituting for attorneys at their request and satisfaction who are members of the private bar in the Juvenile Sections of the Family Divisions of the Wayne County, Oakland County and Macomb County Circuit Courts. Further Affiant states that most of the member attorneys have relevant delinquency experience and training through handling criminal matters as they are also on the criminal court appointed lists in these counties. In addition, Affiant states that several of these member attorneys have filed various motions in juvenile matters, whether compensated or not, have filed petitions on behalf of juveniles and are on the court appointed list for appeals in neglect and abuse cases. Affiant also states that in addition to identifying attorneys interested in the aggressive representation of children and their best interests, it was also important to have attorneys who reflect the diverse population of Wayne County. Affiant states that of the six members of this company, three are females and three are males of which one is African American and one is Arabic.
4. Affiant states that on November 9, 2006, the Articles of Organization were filed with the State of Michigan indicating that the duration of the company was perpetual, the purpose of the organization was to provide legal representation to juveniles in Wayne County and that the company would be member managed. Further Affiant states that on November 21, 2006 all members approved the Operating Agreement giving each member an equal membership interest. In addition, Affiant states that the company does not have any employees, any designated managers, any subcontractors or any agents and that all legal services provided are provided by the attorney members themselves.

5. After the company was awarded a contract, assigned to *one* referee's courtroom and began its representation, Affiant states that she initiated a system as cases were assigned to the company. The system included assigning one of the member attorneys to handle the case; the identification of a conflicts procedure resulting in the withdrawal of representation in several cases where deemed appropriate; a central location of the case files as well as standardization of the case file contents to include relevant pleadings and court orders and notes made by the assigned member attorney; and preparing the court required reports etc. Affiant states that this system ensures communication between the member attorneys as to the status of any case resulting in effective and manageable representation of the juveniles.
6. However Affiant states that the company has encountered some difficulties with the transfer of the cases, both delinquency and neglect and abuse, from the private bar attorneys previously assigned to those cases. In some cases the private bar attorney did not attend the scheduled hearing resulting in one of the member attorneys being assigned the case; but a smooth transition did not occur. In at least one instance, Affiant states that the private bar attorney abandoned the case to the detriment of the juvenile by failing to appear on the day and time set for trial resulting in the court having to adjourn and reschedule the matter. In spite of these difficulties in transition of some of these matters, Affiant states that the company has and is working through them while continuing to provide effective representation.
7. If sworn as a witness, Affiant can testify competently to the facts stated in this affidavit.

Affidavit of Child and Family Law Center PLLC.

Now comes the Child & Family Law Center, by and through its co-managing partners who being first duly sworn, state under oath as follows.

Background

1. Child & Family Law Center PLLC is a professional limited liability corporation organized in 2004 under the provisions of the Michigan Limited Liability Company Act Public Act 23 of 1993.
2. The principal office of The Child & Family Law Center is located at 2048 Washtenaw Ave. Ypsilanti, Michigan 48197. The phone number is 734-482-0805. The e-mail address is CAFLC@CAFLC.org. The URL on the World Wide Web is <http://www.cafc.org>.
3. The mission statement of the Child & Family Law Center is "Serving the legal needs of children and the families who care for them. Kids need balance."
4. Child & Family Law Center has accepted court appointments in the Wayne County Juvenile Court since January 1, 2005.
5. On or about November 16, 2006, Child & Family Law Center PLLC signed a contract with the Third Judicial Circuit Court of Michigan to provide legal services in the Wayne County Juvenile Court.
6. Under this contract Child & Family Law Center (CFLC) provides Lawyer - Guardian ad litem (L-Gal) services to minors under the court's protective proceedings and legal defense services to minors under the court's delinquency proceedings.

7. For identification purposes, the Wayne County Juvenile Court has assigned the identifier "CFLC" and the group number "00920" to Child & Family Law Center PLLC.
8. The Wayne County Juvenile Court has assigned CFLC to the courtrooms of Referee Kathleen Svoboda, the Honorable Judge Christopher Dingell, and preliminary hearings.
9. Under the terms of the contract, (Paragraph 1.2.5) CFLC is obligated to provide competent legal representation to the children to whom CFLC is assigned.
10. The standards for competent legal representation are defined by statute (Juvenile Code MCL 712A. 17d), by case law (In re CR, 250 Mich App 185; 646 NW2d 506 (2002)) and by the Michigan Rules of Professional Conduct.

Experience

11. CFLC attorneys are experienced in juvenile law. CFLC attorneys have represented minors at all stages of all types of juvenile cases in juvenile courts in Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, Monroe, Washtenaw, Jackson and Genesee County.
12. The principal lawyers at Child & Family Law Center PLLC are Judith T. New and R. William Schooley.
13. R. William Schooley earned his Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Michigan. He received his Juris Doctorate from the Detroit College of Law. He is a practicing lawyer with over 25 years of legal experience. He has been practicing law since 1978. He is admitted to the United States Supreme Court bar, the United States Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals bar, and all of the Courts of Michigan. He is a former Assistant Public Defender with Washtenaw County where he served for over 15 years as a guardian ad litem in the Juvenile Court. He has handled numerous delinquency and neglect cases. He is presently a member of the Children's Law Section of the State Bar of Michigan. He is specially trained in the forensic interviewing of children. He is a member of the National Association of Counsel for the Children (NACC).
14. Judith T. New earned her Bachelor of Science degree from Tennessee Technological University. She received her Juris Doctorate from Cooley Law School. She is a child and family advocacy attorney. She has been in private practice since 1990. Her advocacy includes working with the Dispute Resolution Centers of Washtenaw and Genesee Counties, as a volunteer mediator and a trainer. She has mediated many disputes in the

delivery of Special Education Services, Individual Education Plans (IEPs), guardianships, permanency planning in protective proceedings, and incorrigibility petitions. Also, she has served as chair of the Washtenaw County Bar Association Juvenile Section and is presently a member of the State Bar of Michigan's Children's Law Section, a long-time member of the Equity Audit Committee for the Ann Arbor Public Schools, and President of the Board of Directors for the Learning Disability Association of Washtenaw. For several years she was a member of the Citizen's Advisory Board for Community Mental Health in Washtenaw County and on the Board of Directors for the Student Advocacy Center of Michigan. Se is a member of the National Association of Counsel for the Children (NACC).

15. There are four other highly experienced attorneys who provide legal services under contract to CFLC. These attorneys are Jenny K. Allgeyer, John Forczak , Carolyn G. Keemer and Melissa E. Palombit,
16. Jenny K. Allgeyer earned her bachelor's degree in Political Science at the University of Michigan—Dearborn. She earned her Juris Doctorate from the Detroit College of Law. She served as a volunteer with the Wayne County Foster Care Review Board for 5 years. She was a chairperson for one of the Wayne County Foster Care Review Boards for 1 year. She has been practicing in juvenile court in Wayne County since 2004. She has also worked as an emergency medical technician with the Children's Hospital of Michigan's transport team.
17. Carolyn G. Keemer is a life long resident of the Detroit metropolitan area. She received her Bachelors degree from University of Michigan. She received her Juris Doctorate from University of Detroit Mercy Law School. She has been in practice for 23 years. She served eight years as the City Prosecutor for Royal Oak Township. She has a broad range of experience from criminal law, municipal law, general civil, and labor relations. Since 1995, she has focused on juvenile law in the Wayne County Juvenile Court. She has represented both juveniles in delinquency cases and parents in neglect cases.
18. Melissa E. Palombit received her Bachelors degree from Michigan State University. She received her Juris Doctorate from the University of Detroit Mercy Law School. She won the Aline Felton-Berkley Scholarship. While in law school, she became interested in juvenile and family law. She has volunteered at the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office. She has served as a legal intern for AAA of Michigan. She provides on-call legal advice with the Counsel and Advocacy Law Line in Southfield Michigan.
19. John Forczak earned his undergraduate degree from Wayne State University. He also received his Juris Doctorate from Wayne State

University Law School. He has been in private practice since 1975. He has a long standing commitment to public service and poverty programs. He has been an attorney with Wayne County Neighborhood Legal Services, Student Legal Services, Michigan Legal Services, and Legal Aid and Defender. At the Wayne County Neighborhood Legal Services, he handled housing, consumer, domestic, and administrative cases. At Student Legal Services, he handled criminal, domestic, and housing cases. At the Michigan Legal Services, he was the juvenile and family law specialist. At Legal Aid and Defender he handled civil and criminal cases. Since entering private practice he handles juvenile, civil, and criminal cases. He serves as a council member on both the Children's Law Section and the Family Law Section of the Michigan State Bar.

20. Each CFLC attorney providing legal representation is qualified, and remains qualified to receive appointments under the current local administrative order regarding court appointment of attorneys.
21. CFLC requires each attorney to participate in the annual mandatory training, the Michigan Children's Law Section annual training, and at least one nationally recognized training each year.
22. All attorneys with CFLC are monitored and mentored by the co-managing partners to ensure consistent and competent representation.

Legal Representation, Home Visits and Client Contact

23. Each child client is represented by the law firm of Child & Family Law Center PLLC. The full strength, resources and economies of scale of this law firm are employed for each child client. Within a team environment, the objective for protective proceedings is to have one attorney consistently represent the child client from the preliminary hearing and until the court ends its involvement.
24. For delinquency caseload, CFLC has developed procedures that ensure client contact and case preparation prior to the pre-trial. Under the prior system, House Counsel was appointed to represent the juvenile at the pre-trial. Currently, as soon as the minor is entered into the court's database system, CFLC begins to compile a case file and contact the minor and his or her family. In the weeks prior to the scheduled pre-trial date, contact letters are sent and telephone calls are made. The legal file is reviewed and discovery requested. The Wayne County Prosecutor's office is contacted for possible plea negotiations. Minors who are being detained are interviewed at the Juvenile Detention Center.
25. There is one attorney assigned as primary point of contact for the child client during the time the case is open.

26. In rare circumstances, if the primary attorney is not available, another CFLC attorney who is familiar with the file may attend a court hearing. Because of CFLC's team approach, each attorney has a familiarity with the more that their own caseload. Each attorney is able to effectively stand-in for another without compromising our responsibility to our client.
27. All CFLC attorneys comply with the Michigan Rules of Professional Conduct and the statutory L-GAL duties of MCL 712A.17d.
28. All CFLC attorneys are also expected to comply with the requirements of the Michigan Lawyer-Guardian Ad Litem Protocol.
29. CFLC attorneys conduct independent investigations and meet with the child client. CFLC has developed a standardized format for the attorneys to use on home visits. Information that is learned by any CFLC attorney is entered into each file on a standardized case log form.
30. Visits with minor children are scheduled Mondays through Fridays and some weekends. Visits are scheduled CFLC attorneys to avoid removing the children from school. Weekend visits are set to interview children who were unavailable during the week. Visiting minor children outside of the State of Michigan or who are placed more than 100 miles from Wayne County will be dealt with on a case by case basis.
31. CFLC has a website, at <http://www.cafc.org>. Through this website, our child clients have access to their attorney on a 24/7 basis. The internet, e-mail and the CFLC website make it possible for child clients to communicate with us on their terms and their timetables.
32. CFLC attorneys attend Foster Care Review Board meetings and Department of Human Services Team Decision Meetings. CFLC believes that our involvement at FCRB and TDM's better enables us to represent the children clients in the Wayne County Juvenile Court.

Compensation

33. CFLC has given careful consideration to its compensation structure. It is based on available data of compensation paid to similarly situated attorneys, in order to assure a fair compensation package. Attorney FTE daily compensation is equal for all CFLC attorneys, because this fosters a unified team.
34. CFLC took the following data into account when setting its compensation package:


35. The state average weekly wage for 2006 of \$784.31 per week or \$40,784 per year (Source: Michigan Department of Labor);
36. The Wayne County average weekly wage of \$894 per week or \$46,488 per year (Source: Federal Bureau of Labor Statistics);
37. The average starting salary figure for all graduating attorneys of \$49,000 per year according to the 2005 Cooley Employment and Salary Survey and
38. An attorney staff position EP-15 with two years experience under the Michigan Civil Service Commission Compensation Plan effective April 9, 2006, has a salary of \$49,882 per year.
39. Under normal circumstances, CFLC has 4 full time equivalent (FTE) attorneys scheduled on duty at any given time. Compensation is paid on a flat rate per half day of service for each FTE. On a full time equivalent basis, CFLC pays each attorney a living middle class wage in line with the research identified in paragraphs 38 to 41. Whether a manager or contractor, each CFLC attorney is paid equally and at a rate in line with prevailing attorney salaries.
40. CFLC pays for continuing legal education.

Office and case management


41. CFLC schedules at least one attorney on duty in the courthouse at all time the court is open.
42. CFLC plans on having 4 full time equivalent (FTE) attorneys on duty at any given time. Not all attorney duties are performed in the courthouse. At least two of these attorneys are on duty to Referee Svoboda when she is on the bench.
43. CFLC has a half day staffing structure. This permits up to six attorneys being assigned to our various courtrooms in response to changing court load demands.
44. All CFLC attorneys primarily assigned to neglect cases are scheduled so that each attorney sees and interacts with all team members. This permits regular and frequent communication between attorneys and attorney with support staff. Likewise, all CFLC attorneys primarily assigned to delinquency cases are scheduled so that each attorney sees and interacts with all team members.

45. The CFLC attorney scheduling is done on a rotating two-week block basis that tracks the courts 60% /40% neglect to delinquency scheduling. This method of scheduling permits each attorney time to prepare and to do home visits. Cases up for hearing within the next two weeks to one month are able to be reviewed for scheduling concerns
46. CFLC presently uses a docket and calendar case management system. Each attorney keeps his or her own calendar. There is a master calendar kept by the office which tracks the attorneys on duty, their duty station and their caseload. CFLC, on a daily basis, consults and coordinates with the court's docket and AS 400 computer system.
47. CFLC is in the process of developing and implementing a computer-based case management system. When fully implemented, this case management system will act as a staffing multiplier.
48. The computer case management system will provide CFLC attorneys with a shared database containing all case and client specific information, conflict of interest searching, office wide calendars and routine document generation.
49. CFLC has an office policy and procedures manual that is continuously updated in response to changing circumstances.

- 3. I am a member of The Juvenile Law Group, PLLC which was granted a contract to provide representation for juveniles in the Third Circuit Court.**
- 4. That the "Group" consists of four attorneys who have numerous years of experience in the Juvenile Court, particularly in the representation of juveniles.**
- 5. That one member of the group has in excess of 20 years of representation of juveniles in both delinquency and neglect proceedings. Another member has over 15 years of experience in these matters. I personally have over ten years of experience as a private attorney in the Juvenile Court in addition to three years in the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office.**
- 6. That each member of the Group has extensive experience and training in matters coming before the Juvenile Court, criminal matters and general family law matters.**
- 7. That each member of the group is highly trained and is eligible to receive appointments in the Court.**
- 8. That each member, by virtue of the language in the contract will remain qualified to practice in the Court and will receive annual training to remain eligible to provide such services.**
- 9. That each client represented by the Group will have an individual specific attorney**

assigned to him or her. Further, that the Group will utilize a team approach for purposes of consultation and review.

10. That each client will have emergency contact numbers made available to him or her for their respective attorney in the event such a need arises.

11. That the Group has support staff who among other duties will, contact clients for scheduling of personal visits, be available for clients for issues not requiring legal advice, ensure all cases are covered as scheduled and apportion each attorney's respective caseload. The use of support staff will allow individual attorneys in the Group to focus their energies on representing our clients.

12. That the Group is in the process of utilizing and implementing technology that allows each member to access case files and schedules at any time for consistent representation.

13. That the use of technology and communication by Group members will ensure efficient use of Group resources.

14. That the Group, by virtue of contract language, has the ability to request the Court award extraordinary fees that may result in the representation of its clients. The ability to make such requests ensures that each client will be adequately and effectively represented without a regard to cost.

15. That given the number of years that Group members have practiced before the Court, invariably conflicts of interest may occur. Each member will exercise his or her ethical duty to inform the Court of any such conflicts and request withdrawal which is contemplated in the contract.

16. That the contract allows the Group to review its compensation agreement with the Court thus ensuring adequate compensation for the services the Group will provide.

17. That the implementation of the contractual group system is an effective method to ensure that children who appear before the Court have qualified and consistent representation. That said system eliminates the practice of substitute counsel appearing

at hearings on behalf of children without any knowledge of the history of the case or the client's individual needs.


18. That this approach ensures that children's interests are advocated uniformly.

19. That the team based approach provides our clients with access to the "Group's" attorneys on a regular basis in compliance with state and local court rules. That such a method allows the Group's clients to build trust and comfort with Group members.

20. That the Group's membership includes African-American attorneys who are familiar with the cultural and specific needs of the community for which it will serve.

21. Finally, the Group believes that the current system and its implementation provide safeguards for the continued effective assistance of counsel for children appearing before the Court. Further, that the system ensures that representation will not be based on expediency but rather on the best interests of the respective client.


Barbara A. Menear, first being duly sworn, deposes and says the following:

1. The facts stated herein are within my personal knowledge or are reflected in the official records for the Seventh Judicial Circuit Court, of which I have personal knowledge. I am competent to testify to these facts, and will do so if called as a witness.
2. During all times pertinent hereto, I was, and continue to be, the Court Administrator for the Seventh Judicial Circuit Court, Genesee County, Michigan (hereinafter "the Court").
3. In 2004, the Court entered into a contract with a group of attorneys to provide exclusive representation for all juveniles (except in instances of conflict of interest) who were the subject of juvenile proceedings in the Court.
4. Under this contract, the attorney group designates one of its members to provide representation for juveniles in all neglect and delinquency proceedings (except in instances of conflict of interest).
5. Since 2004, the Court has renewed the contract with the attorney group, and it is the method that the Court currently uses to provide representation for juveniles.

6. The Court migrated to this system of appointing counsel, after due deliberation and concluding that it was in the best interest of juveniles and the proper administration of justice.

7. This system of appointing counsel promotes continuity of representation, eliminates substitutions of counsel and reduces scheduling problems and adjournments.

REGINA DANIELS THOMAS, being first duly sworn, deposes and says that:

1. I am Chief Counsel of the Juvenile Law Group of Legal Aid and Defender Association, Inc. (LAD). LAD is a private non-profit corporation which provides legal services to the indigent populations of Wayne, Oakland and Macomb County. LAD has been providing legal services since 1909.
2. The Juvenile Law Group is one of four divisions of LAD. As a part of LAD the Juvenile Law Group is provided administrative services which include but are not


limited to Human Resources, Technology Support, access to LAD's onsite Law Library in addition to access to Westlaw. Due to its unique position as a part of LAD the Juvenile Law Group is able to refer cases to the Civil Law Group for social work services as well as legal services in the area of public benefits and education.

3. The Juvenile Law Group provides legal services solely to minors in child protection and juvenile delinquency proceedings in Wayne County. LAD has provided these services for over 20 years. While the remaining three divisions represent adults none of the divisions represent adults in child protection proceedings in any county.
4. There are 18 full time attorneys and 6 Support Staff including a Paralegal/Investigator employed by the Juvenile Law Group of LAD. All staff compensation includes salary and benefits (which include but are not limited to full medical, dental, vision, short term disability and paid sick, vacation and personal leave time). Attorney Staff is also provided with training outside of that which is required by the Third Judicial Circuit to be eligible to receive assignments through the assigned counsel system. The attorneys employed by the Juvenile Law Group of LAD have years of experience representing children in both Child Protection and Delinquency Proceedings in Wayne County. 50% of the attorney staff is African-American.
5. The Juvenile Law Group utilizes Law student interns, Paralegal interns, High School vocational interns, Social Work interns as well as Job Corp interns in an effort to better assist its client population.
6. All cases assigned to LAD by the Third Circuit Court are assigned to individual attorneys within the Juvenile Law Group and these attorneys have responsibility for all statutory duties. Caseloads are monitored to ensure both an equitable distribution of work within the law group and the ability to perform statutory as well as ethical obligations for LAD's clients.
7. Each attorney employed by the Juvenile Law Group of LAD is an attorney in good standing, licensed to practice law in the State of Michigan and eligible to receive assignments from the court pursuant to Administrative Order 2006-08.
8. LAD utilizes a case management system which identifies possible conflicts which are then reviewed and dealt with in accordance with the Rules of Professional and Ethical Responsibility. Cases are also evaluated for possible conflicts when attorneys are employed with LAD and may have represented an adverse party on any cases being serviced by LAD. When conflicts are identified the Third Circuit Court is notified and the case is reassigned.
9. As it relates to Minor Plaintiff Nadia E. Attorney Radulovich appeared on this case until 2/07. The next hearing date is 6/4/2007. MCL 712A.17c requires the LGAL to carry out its duties prior to all hearings. There is no violation of statute or negligence in carrying out LAD's duty as LGAL as of the filing of the Complaint for Superintending Control.
10. As it relates to Minor Plaintiff Tommie P- When the initial Order of Removal was generated the order indicated the new counsel would be CHAP (a contract group other than LAD). An order was generated on 4/9/2007 assigning this case to LAD. The next hearing date is 5/17/2007. MCL 712A.17c requires the LGAL to


carry out its duties prior to all hearings. There is no violation of statute or negligence in carrying out LAD's duty as LGAL as of the filing of the Complaint for Superintending Control.

11. As it relates to the Robertson-Hensley family, Case #06-457,805. LAD was appointed in November 2006 as a result of the assigned L-GAL's failure to appear at the November 2006 court date. Lorena Jaquet was assigned this matter and appeared at a Motion Hearing on December 15, 2006.
12. Due to conflicting court schedules Attorney William Ladd appeared and represented the children on December 20, 2006 with the benefit of the file and after consulting with Attorney Jaquet. On February 14, 2007 Attorney Jaquet left her employment with LAD and this matter was assigned to Attorney Ladd as he was familiar with the case and the circumstances. Attorney Ladd appeared at the February 21, 2007 in his capacity as the LAD attorney assigned to the Robertson-Hensley children. The worker assigned to the case, however, did not have the reports requested by the court and the matter was held in progress to February 28, 2007 a date for which Attorney Ladd was unavailable due to having two trials scheduled before two other jurists.
13. Attorney Reynolds appeared at the February 28, 2007 hearing with the benefit of the file, having consulted with Attorney Ladd as well as the complete reports as provided by the assigned caseworker on that date. While Attorney Reynolds position was different from that of Attorney Brand, in representing the mother, that in and of itself does not mean she was ill prepared or not acting in the best interest of the children. Attorney Reynolds requested supervised visits at the agency and not supervised by the father in his home as the mother has attempted suicide in the father's home.

AFFIDAVIT OF FREDERICK H. GRUBER

Frederick H. Gruber, being duly sworn, deposes and says as follows:

1. I am the Director of the Michigan Children's Law Center.
2. The Michigan Children's Law Center utilizes 26 attorneys and is assigned six courtrooms at the Lincoln Hall of Justice to provide legal representation to children in neglect, abuse and delinquency cases.
3. The attorneys' collective experience in the area of child law is 291 years.
4. Plaintiffs' Complaint for Superintending Control identifies seven cases re-assigned to MCLC. In all but one of these cases, MCLC has assigned a specific attorney to act as the successor Lawyer Guardian ad Litem. In the seventh case, MCLC has not yet received a removal order.
5. For each of the seven reported files, the individual Plaintiff, who was the former Lawyer Guardian Ad Litem, did nothing to facilitate the transfer of files, as required by the Court's Removal Order.
6. Specifically, the Order of Removal of Assigned Counsel provides:

It is Further Ordered that upon the entry of this Order, the removed counsel shall provide to newly appointed counsel the following documents as soon as possible:

- (1) the petition and any supplemental petitions;
- (2) any findings of fact or law;
- (3) any orders;
- (4) the most recent court report; and
- (5) the most recent placement information about the juvenile including the name, address and telephone number of the current caregiver.


None of these documents was provided to the assigned MCLC attorney in each of these seven cases. Further, none of these individual Plaintiffs communicated or attempted to communicate with the MCLC attorney to relate any issue regarding the subject child or children that required immediate attention.

7. Despite the lack of the cooperation from the former LGALs, MCLC attorneys exercised due diligence in seeking out the information themselves, and, in majority of those seven cases, was able to satisfy the requirements set forth in MCL 712A.17d.
8. In four of the cases named: Clarence S., William and Wesley D., Justin S. and Naomi S. cases, the statutory duties have been met.
9. With regard to the Kimberly S. case, MCLC has not received a removal order.
10. With regard to the Terri N. and Tony B. cases, despite the Court Orders of Removal, the Plaintiffs - former LGALs continue to appear at the scheduled hearings and insist that they are still the LGALs in those cases. The MCLC attorneys have not been advised as to how to handle those situations.
11. The Court's own computerized process and procedure requires identification of legal counsel by group name. Nonetheless, as stated above, MCLC has assigned the referenced cases to an individual attorney.

AFFIDAVIT OF BERNARD J. KOST

Bernard J. Kost, first being duly sworn, deposes and says:

1. I make this affidavit in support of the defendants' Answer to the Complaint for Superintending Control filed in the above captioned case and the Brief in Support of Answer.
2. The facts stated herein are within my own personal knowledge or are based on official records of the Third Circuit Court or data compiled from computerized databases. I am competent to testify to these facts, and will do so if called as a witness.

3. During all the time periods relevant to this case, I was and continue to be the Executive Court Administrator for the Third Circuit Court.
4. In the Third Circuit Court, one section of the Court's Family Division is the Juvenile Section. The judges and referees assigned to the Juvenile Section adjudicate delinquency and neglect cases. The judicial staff of the Juvenile Section is comprised of a presiding judge and six other judges. They are supported by referees including the chief referee and thirteen other referees.
5. According to the Court's records, in 2006, the last year in which assignments under LAO 2006-01 were made, the Court made assignments in juvenile matters to 288 attorneys. Thirty-seven attorneys, including five of the six Plaintiff Attorneys, each received in excess of 100 assignments.
6. Payments were made to the attorneys on a per phase or proceeding basis according to the provisions of a fee schedule. In 2006, the payments to attorneys totaled approximately \$5.2 million.
7. Court records reflect that in 2006, Plaintiff Attorney Brand received 216 assignments; Plaintiff Attorney Devine received 135 assignments; Plaintiff Attorney Radulovich received 121 assignments; Plaintiff Attorney Trent received 118 assignments; Plaintiff Attorney Shillingford received 102 assignments; and Plaintiff Attorney Ruby received 83 assignments.
8. The average compensation paid to the attorneys was approximately \$18,500 with the median amount being \$13,175.
9. The Plaintiff Attorneys were each paid in excess of \$35,000. Plaintiff Attorney Brand was paid \$80,800; Plaintiff Attorney Radulovich was paid \$51,775; Plaintiff Attorney Devine was paid \$50,750; Plaintiff Attorney Trent was paid \$47,350; Plaintiff Attorney Shillingford was paid \$39,650; and Plaintiff Attorney Ruby was paid \$35,325. When compared to all attorneys who received compensation from the Court as a result of juvenile assignments, the Plaintiff Attorneys fell within the top 35 or 12% of those attorneys.
10. Before moving to a system of appointing counsel through contracting with a group of attorneys to provide representation to juveniles who appear before a referee, I became aware that, as attested to by the affidavit of Barbara Menear, the Seventh Circuit Court had in 2004 successfully adopted a system similar to the one adopted by the Third Circuit Court in this case.
11. Subsequent to the issuance of a request for proposal, a copy of which is attached as plaintiffs' exhibit 2, and an evaluation of the various proposals, the Court entered into contracts with the Legal Aid & Defender Association (LAD) for six referee courtrooms (effective October 1, 2006); the Michigan Children's Law Center (MCLC)

for four referee courtrooms (effective November 1, 2006); the Child Advocacy Program (CAP) and the Child and Family Law Center (CFLC) for one referee courtroom each (each effective December 1, 2006); and the Juvenile Law Group (JLG) for the half docket of the Chief Referee and other miscellaneous dockets (effective April 16, 2007).


12. Subsequent to the promulgation of LAO 2006-08, attached as exhibit 1 to the Complaint, on October 27, 2006, the State Court Administrative Office (SCAO) transmitted its approval of LAO 2006-08.
13. The first of the reassignment orders generated to effect the removal of counsel under LAO 2006-08(III)(D)(2) and reassignment to the attorney groups was issued in October 2006. Ultimately, approximately 3,000 orders were issued.
14. I was aware that implementing the new system of assignments would entail significant costs, both in terms of employee hours and salary costs. Had there been a legal challenge to the validity of LAO 2006-08 and the new system of reassignment, the Court would have delayed entering into the remaining contracts and implementing the new system.
15. As shown in the table in footnote one,¹ between November 2006 and April 10, 2007, it is estimated that at least 1800 employee hours were expended to conclude

the contracts with the other vendors and implement the new system of assignment. This included numerous meetings between top administrators of the Court, time spent by legal counsel, mid-level managerial meetings, computer programming and work performed by clerical staff.

16. Based on my knowledge of the applicable wage rates for the employees involved in negotiating the remaining contracts and implementing the new assignment system, the cost to the Court in wages (not including the cost of associated fringe benefits) was at least approximately \$62,000.
17. The difficulties in undoing the present system would compound the initial efforts expended to establish it, and the cost to the Court in employee hours and salaries to restore all of the previous attorney assignments, in my professional judgment, would range between one and one half to twice that expended for the initial implementation. In other words, should the defendants be required to re-establish the previous system, at least 2700 employee hours would be needed at an approximate cost of almost \$100,000.
18. Altogether therefore, should the defendants be required to restore the old system as a result of plaintiffs' lawsuit, the Court will have needlessly used or will use approximately 4500 employee hours, and have incurred or will incur at least a total of approximately \$162,000 in salaries.
19. Attached are copies of docket printouts from the Register of Actions for Terri N., Case No. 91-395330 and Tony B., Case No. 00-386361, and two tables compiled from the Third Circuit Court's computerized database: the first showing the hearings where Plaintiff Attorneys were assigned and used a substitute in a juvenile matter in two one-week periods, and the second showing a list of hearings in that same two-week period where a substitute attorney was used in a juvenile matter.
